

Rico was educated in the Oak Park Public School system where his love for his instrument started at the early age of 12. He excelled at playing his trumpet so much so that he was one of the only middle school students placed into the Oak Park High School band. He continued playing with the Oak Park High School band as well as the Motor City Fire band traveling the country to participate in various marching band classics. Rico continued this rigorous routine until he received his high school diploma in June 2018. His constant practice and hard work earned him several college scholarships but he chose to attend Texas Southern University where he played the trumpet with the TSU Ocean of Soul band. He became a member of the Gamma Omega chapter of Kappa Kappa Psi National Honorary Band Fraternity in the spring 2022. To represent his line number and celebrate his entering his fraternity, Rico proudly created the phrase, "The 3 finally free, now he can live in peace." Rico earned his Bachelors of Arts degree in Radio, Television and Film and was set to

Rico's musical talent gave him various opportunities including a solo feature during the 2021 Detroit Lions Thanksgiving game half time show as well as playing at the 2022 NCAA Men's National Basketball Tournament. He also participated in various performances including Mardi Gras, Circle City Classic and the Houston Rockets. His creativity did not stop with his many band accomplishments. He developed Ricnotes Production LLC, where he produced music and released his first single titled "Freestyle" in November 2020. Rico enjoyed spending time in the studio and making music with his family.

Rico's smooth and laid-back personality charmed everyone that knew him. No matter how suave he was you saw his personality emit anytime he grasped his instrument. The young man that he had become was nothing but a joy to observe, and the radiant star that he had become will be truly missed.

Rico made his transition on April 7, 2022. His great-grandfathers, William Ward and Dewitt Bailey and great-grandmothers, Loretta Little-Ward and Mary Moore, preceded him in death.




