APRIL 26, 1954 - FEBRUARY 12, 2024

On April 26, 1954, God looked over the heavens and plucked a special twinkling star out of the sky. He gave this star in the form of a baby girl to Albert and Matilda Foster. They named her Lilette Louise after her maternal grandmother (Louise Rowe) and great-aunt (Lilette Marchant). She was the oldest of Albert & Matilda's six children. Her father preceded her in death.

Lilette received her early elementary education in the Detroit Public School system. In 1962, the family moved to Highland Park, MI where she attended Highland Park Public Schools graduating from Highland Park High School in 1972. Following graduation, Lilette attended Michigan State University for two years before returning home and attending Wayne State University to study mortuary science.

Lilette gave her life to Christ at a young age and was baptized at her family's church, Bethel AME. At age 13, her angelic voice was recognized. It caught the attention of Barry Alexander who was so impressed that asked her parents to let her and her younger sister, Laura join his choir, The Impressions.
